



From the Desk of Chief Domonic Campbell July Monthly Report for Police Department

Date: August 1, 2018

Special Notes

We collected 4.2 pounds of pills this month.

Jessica Howard began working for our department this month. She was hired to eventually take the place of Master Officer John Tate who will retire at the end of August. She will begin field training next month.

Chief Campbell attended the North Carolina Police Executives Association Conference in Wilmington on July 23rd – 25th. Some of the topics covered at this conference included: Opioid misuse/opioid epidemic, legal and legislative updates, tactical public relations/proactive press plan, policing in the future, active shooter – new strategies, and 2016 Charlotte unrest – cause, response & lessons.

This month we celebrated Officer Hinson's birthday.

Events of interest for the month of July 2018

1. There were twenty-four (24) incidents that were investigated this month.

- **July 1st – Injury to real property.** A resident of Bogie Drive reported that someone had shot at her vehicle with a paintball gun. An officer noticed others traffic and village signs with paintball paint residue. The officer heard Moore County 911 radio traffic about a vehicle that was stopped in Aberdeen related to subjects shooting paintballs at signs and vehicles. The officer advised that Whispering Pines had similar damage. The vehicle that had been stopped in Aberdeen belonged to a Birdie Drive resident in Whispering Pines. An officer went to that address and spoke with the father of one of the subjects who advised that his son and two other boys had been shooting paintball guns at their home, but didn't know they were shooting the guns anywhere else. The officer obtained a criminal summons for each of the three teenagers.
- **July 3rd – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** Someone reported two Pit Bull dogs were fighting on Pine Ridge Drive. When the officer arrived, he didn't see any dogs in the area but saw a woman who told the officer that she went to let her dog out of the house and before she could get a leash on her dog, he ran toward another dog that was being walked on a leash. The officer issued the dog owner a warning ticket for the violation since this was the first violation for this owner. Her dog injured the other dog but she had already agreed with the other dog owner to handle any vet bills that resulted.
- **July 5th – Failure to appear on a taking migratory waterfowl and using an unplugged shotgun charges.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer determined that the driver of the vehicle had an active order for arrest out of Robeson County for failure to appear on a taking migratory waterfowl and using an unplugged shotgun. The driver was placed under arrest.
- **July 6th – Failure to report an accident.** An officer received a call that a hit and run had occurred in the Food Lion parking lot. When they arrived, a man said that he had been walking out of the store when he was struck by a vehicle. The officer requested EMS to come and check out the man. He was able to give the officer a description of the vehicle and the license plate number. The man was transported by EMS to the hospital to be checked out. The officer was able to obtain video from Food Lion that captured the incident. The officer was able to determine that the owner of the vehicle lived in Pinehurst. The officer went to the Pinehurst Police Department to have an officer go with him to the vehicle owner's residence. When they arrived at the residence they saw the vehicle that was involved. They spoke to the vehicle owner and obtained a statement. The

officer then went to the Magistrate's office to take out a warrant on the vehicle owner/driver. The Pinehurst Police Department arrested the man on our outstanding warrant.

- **July 13th – Failure to appear on a driving while license revoked charge.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer determined that the driver had an active order for arrest out of Cumberland County for failing to appear on a driving while license revoked charge and a failure to stop at a stop sign charge. The officer issued the driver a citation for speeding, driving while license revoked, expired registration, and an inspection violation. The driver was then placed under arrest.
- **July 14th – Failure to appear on a driving while license revoked charge.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer determined that the driver of the vehicle had an active order for arrest out of Hoke County for failure to appear on a driving while license revoked charge and speeding charge. The driver was placed under arrest.
- **July 15th – Failure to appear on a carrying concealed weapon charge.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer determined that a passenger in the vehicle had an outstanding order for arrest out of Guilford County for failure to appear on a carrying a concealed weapon charge. The driver was issued a citation for speeding. The passenger was then placed under arrest.
- **July 15th – Possession of marijuana paraphernalia.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer obtained consent to search the vehicle. The officer found a marijuana pipe, rolling papers, and soda can that was turned into a smoking device. The officer photographed these items and then seized them for placement into evidence. The driver was issued a citation for possession of marijuana paraphernalia, expired registration, and an inspection violation. The passenger in the vehicle was issued a citation for possession of drug paraphernalia.
- **July 17th – Identity theft.** A resident of Victoria Drive reported that he received a call from a rental car company in California stating that his wife had rented a vehicle and never returned the vehicle. The resident stated that his wife did not rent a vehicle in California. He then received a call from someone claiming to be investigating the missing car and said that his wife needed to file a report with her local police department. The resident was advised to contact the police department in California where the vehicle was rented to advise that his wife was a victim of a fraud.
- **July 18th – Voluntary commitment.** An officer received a call in reference to an intoxicated female at a residence on Shadow Drive. The resident said his adult daughter had been drinking and running around outside. The resident was worried about his daughter's safety. While speaking to her mother she stated she was thinking about hurting herself. The daughter went in her room and tied a

- scarf around her neck. The officer contacted EMS to come to the scene. The officer asked the daughter if she would voluntarily go with EMS to the hospital or the officer would take her to the hospital involuntarily. She agreed to go with EMS voluntarily.
- **July 18th – Failure to return rental property.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer determined that the driver of the vehicle had an active criminal summons out of Cumberland County for failure to return rental property. The officer contacted the Cumberland County Magistrate’s Office to obtain a court date for the criminal summons. The officer served the driver with the criminal summons. The officer also issued the driver a citation for an expired registration and an inspection violation.
 - **July 18th – Trespassing.** A resident of Lakeview Drive reported that an unwanted female guest was on his property at this front door. Officers had recently had an encounter with this female at she had been banned from that residence in the officer’s presence. The resident told the officers that someone rang his doorbell and when he looked out he saw the banned female. He told her he was going to call the police. The officer began looking for the female and found her in the backyard staring into a window on the back door. The officer placed the female under arrest for trespassing.
 - **July 19th – Possess malt beverage by person less than 19 years old.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer asked the driver if there were any drugs or alcohol in the vehicle. The driver stated that there were some cans of beer in the back seat. The driver handed the officer a bag containing multiple beer cans. The officer photographed the beer and then emptied the contents of the beer cans. The driver was issued a citation for possession of a malt beverage while being less than 19 years old and a brake light violation.
 - **July 21st – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** A resident of Pine Lake Drive reported finding a dog in their front yard. The officer went to the residence and picked up the dog. The officer brought the dog to the police department and placed the dog in the police kennel. The owner of the dog, a Winding Trail resident, picked up his dog the following day. An officer issued the dog owner a warning ticket for the violation since this was the first violation.
 - **July 21st – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** An officer observed a woman at a park on South Lakeshore Drive with two large dogs running around without being on a leash. The officer approached the woman and advised her about the ordinance pertaining to dogs. The officer issued the woman a warning ticket for the violation since this was the first violation.
 - **July 23rd – Possessing an open container of alcohol in vehicle.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer observed a front seat passenger with an opened bottle of beer between his legs and an empty beer bottle at his feet. After searching the vehicle, the officer found a six pack of beer as well. The officer photographed

the items and then poured out the beer on the ground. The passenger was issued a citation for possession of an open container. The driver was issued a citation for speeding, no operator's license, and no insurance.

- **July 23rd – Failure to appear on a driving while impaired charge.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer determined that the driver of the vehicle had an outstanding order for arrest out of Robeson County for failure to appear on a driving while impaired charge. The driver was issued a citation for an expired registration and the passenger was issued a citation for failing to wear his seatbelt. The driver was then placed under arrest.
- **July 24th – Identity theft.** A resident of Airport Road reported that she received an email that indicated that she needed to finish a few final steps to activate her account. She then received two more emails indicating that her Walmart cards were on their way and she needed to finish activating her account. She contacted the company and found out that someone used her social security number to set up two banking accounts. She informed them that it was fraudulent. They advised her to file a police report.
- **July 27th – Release order violation.** A resident of Lakeview Drive reported that a female tried to contact him by sending an email. He has an active protective order that states she is not to contact him. The female is currently in the Moore County Jail and per the Magistrate there is no violation of the release order since she hasn't been released from the jail. The order takes effect after she is released.
- **July 28th – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** A resident of Sabbatia Drive reported a dog was running loose and ran out from a yard on Milk Pea Road. The officer went to the dog owner residence and the dog owner told the officer that his dog had gotten on of the yard. The officer issued the dog owner a warning ticket since this was the first violation by this dog owner.
- **July 29th – Failure to appear on an obtaining property by false pretense charge.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer determined that a passenger in the vehicle had an active order for arrest out of Durham County for failure to appear on an obtaining property by false pretense charge. The officer placed the passenger under arrest and transported him to the Moore County Jail. The officer also issued a citation to the driver for displaying an expired registration plate, inspection violation and no operating license.
- **July 29th – Simple assault.** A resident of Lakeview Drive reported being assaulted by his wife. When the officers arrived, the man stated his wife was upset with him and assaulted him. There were no marks visible. The wife told the officer that she assaulted her husband and tried to strangle him. The wife was placed under arrest and transported to the Moore County Jail.
- **July 31st – Vandalism.** A superintendent of the Country Club of Whispering Pines reported vandalism to one of the greens. At hole 1 of the east course the

officer observed spots on the green where it appears gasoline had been poured onto the green. This officer had observed some golf course flags just inside the wood line behind the public works building earlier in the morning. There is a trail that runs from this area to a house on South Lakeshore Drive. The officers followed the trail and found two town street signs, golf course flags on poles and an empty gas can. The officer contacted an employee of the public works department who advised the gas can and signs belonged to them.

- **July 31st – Larceny.** An off duty Whispering Pines Police officer observed a male enter the store and in just a few seconds the male left the store with some bottles of juice that were not in a shopping bag. The officer felt that there had not been enough time to pay for the items. The officer contacted the on-duty officer and they all met with the store manager. The manger checked the store video which verified what the off-duty officer had witnessed. The store manager was also able to verify that no purchase of juice took place at that time. The officers were able to obtain video of the vehicle the man entered after leaving the store with the bottles. One of the officers was familiar with the vehicle and ran the information to determine the identity of the male.

2. There were fifteen (15) arrests this month with a total of 21 charges.

After an arrest, officers are unavailable for at least 2 hours while processing and booking subjects at the Moore County Jail in Carthage. Serving a criminal summons does not require detaining or taking the subject to jail.

- **July 5th.** A criminal summons was served on two of the three offenders in the July 1st injury to real property incident where three teenagers caused damage to street signs with paint ball guns.
- **July 5th** - As a result of a traffic stop the officer determined that the driver of the vehicle had an active order for arrest out of Robeson County for failure to appear on a taking migratory waterfowl and using an unplugged shotgun. The driver was placed under arrest and transported to the Moore County Jail.
- **July 6th** – A criminal summons was served on one of the three offenders in the July 1st injury to real property incident where three teenagers caused damage to street signs with paint ball guns.
- **July 7th** – An arrest was made in connection with the failure to report an accident incident at the Food Lion on July 6th. The Pinehurst Police Department arrested the offender on our arrest warrant.
- **July 13th** - As a result of a traffic stop the officer determined that the driver had an active order for arrest out of Cumberland County for failing to appear on a driving while license revoked charge and a failure to stop at a stop sign charge. The officer issued the driver a citation for speeding, driving while license

revoked, expired registration, and an inspection violation. The driver was then placed under arrest.

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- **July 29th** - As a result of a traffic stop the officer determined that a passenger in the vehicle had an active order for arrest out of Durham County for failure to appear on an obtaining property by false pretense charge. The passenger was placed under arrest and transported to the Moore County Jail.

3. There were three (3) traffic accidents in the Village this month.

- **July 6th** – An accident occurred in the Food Lion parking lot. A vehicle struck a pedestrian that was walking from the store into the parking lot. The vehicle left the scene. The pedestrian was transported by EMS to the hospital to be checked out.
- **July 9th** – An accident occurred on Windsong Place. A vehicle ran off the roadway and struck a mailbox. The vehicle left the scene of the accident.
- **July 31st** – A vehicle was traveling on Niagara Carthage Road when a deer ran out into the roadway and struck the front left door of the vehicle. There were no injuries and the vehicle was able to be driven from the scene.

4. Safety (Department)

- Continuing to have access to equipment and resources which allows us to make our officers safe. Thanks to manager and council.

5. Safety (Village)

- Provided traffic control for Fourth of July parade.

6. Other Events of Interest

- **July 23rd – 25th** – Chief Campbell attended the NC Police Executives Association conference in Wilmington.
- **July 30th** – Senior Officer Holt and Officer Howard attended the Human Trafficking presentation put on by Friend to Friend at Bethesda Presbyterian Church in Aberdeen.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Goal #1: To provide a uniform standard that will enable personnel of the department to be more consistent in procedures when handling situations.

Objective #1: Daily briefings are being conducted by officers at shift changes. The Lieutenant and Sergeant have also discussed monthly schedule and operational concerns with all officers this month.

Objective #2: General Order 026 – Field Training and Evaluation Program policy was revised to complete a restructure our field training and evaluation program.

Objective #3: No policy reviews were conducted this month.

Goal #2: To provide for education and further development of department personnel to enhance officer and department professionalism.

Objective #1: Master Officer Tate successfully completed his DCI – General Inquiries certification test on July 6th.

All police personnel completed the Workplace Stress training that was required by the Village Manager.

Goal #3: Provide for a higher degree of personal contact between community and department personnel.

Objective #1: There were no community events held this month.

Objective #2: Officers welcomed 17 new residents this month and provided the new residents with a police “Welcome Packet” describing many of the services offered by our department.

Objective #3: There were no requests for Child IDs this month.

Objective #4: There was no LEO meeting held this month.

Objective #5: There were no requests for assistance with child seat installations.

Goal #4: Conduct special enforcement programs and participate in GHSP campaigns.

Objective #1: There were no checkpoints this month.

Goal #5: Continue current crime prevention programs to maintain the Village's low crime statistics.

Objective #1: We remain fully staffed. We have hired an officer to begin training to replace Master Officer Tate when he retires on September 1st.

Objective #2: A traffic complaint was received this month about speeding on Lakeview Drive. Officers conducted 20 speed surveys in the area. A total of 2 citations were issued for speeding and six warning tickets for speeding violations were issued. Officer will continue to work in this area in the future.

Objective #3: Officers have conducted:
House checks – 701 (average 23 a day)
Business checks – 923
Store closings – 50

One of our Senior Call Ins moved away this month so we now have a total of 9 seniors in the Senior Call In Program.

Objective #4: Articles were submitted for the Village newsletter on the following topics: Master Officer John Tate's upcoming retirement, clean up after dogs, wear reflective clothing when walking in the dark, request for citizens to obey speed limit, and rules regarding use of golf carts on Village roads.

Objective #5: Officers have conducted 66 foot patrols at the Food Lion Shopping Center this month.

Objective #6: No traffic studies were conducted this month.

Objective #7: We have 6 certified child seat technicians. 5 officers and the Sergeant are certified child seat technicians.

Goal #6: Proactive approach in looking for safety concerns.

Objective#1: Continuing to have access to equipment and resources which allows us to make our officers safe. Thanks to manager and council.

Objective #2: Provided traffic control for Fourth of July parade.

Objective #3: In our efforts to meet OSHA requirements, quarterly and yearly reviews of the Infectious Disease Control Plan have been scheduled. The next quarterly review is scheduled for September 2018.
