



From the Desk of Chief Domonic Campbell August Monthly Report for Police Department

Date: December 3, 2018

Special Notes

We collected 3.1 pounds of pills this month.

Officers have worked many patrols this month in areas where residents have advised of a problem with vehicles passing stopped school buses. In addition, Senior Officer Holt had arranged to actually ride on one of the school buses to see if he could witness any vehicles passing school buses. Officer Holt will continue to ride a few school buses some more in hopes of trying to catch any vehicles passing stopped school buses.

Events of interest for the month of November 2018

- 1. There were twenty (20) incidents that were investigated this month. Of these incidents nine (9) involved an arrest with 17 total charges. *After an arrest, officers are unavailable for at least 2 hours while processing and booking subjects at the Moore County Jail in Carthage. Serving a criminal summons does not require detaining or taking the subject to jail.***
 - **November 4th – Vandalism.** A resident of Pine Crescent Drive reported that someone damaged their front door by shattering a section of glass. Nothing was taken and there were no other visible signs of damage on the door.
 - **November 6th – Possession of marijuana.** As a result of a traffic stop, the officer detected the odor of marijuana while behind the vehicle. When the officer approached the vehicle, he could smell a very strong odor of marijuana. An officer searched the vehicle and found two marijuana cigarettes in the vehicle. They were photographed and seized for placement into evidence. The driver was arrested by citation for possession of marijuana and also received a citation for not having a brake light.
 - **November 7th – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** An officer witnessed a woman standing next to the road with a dog off leash. The officer advised the woman of the ordinance pertaining to dogs and issued the dog owner a warning ticket for the violation.
 - **November 7th – Larceny.** A resident of Pine Ridge Drive reported that a package was delivered to his home but when he returned home there was no package. He believes someone took the package after it was delivered.
 - **November 7th – Outstanding warrants from another jurisdiction.** An officer became aware of active warrants for a person working at a residence on Birdie Drive. The officer went to the residence and placed the person under arrest for warrants for breaking or entering a motor vehicle, larceny after breaking and entering, and financial card theft. The woman was transported to the Moore County Jail.
 - **November 8th – Obtain property by false pretense.** A resident of Goldenleaf Circle reported that she was contacted by a man about a job opening. The resident did some research about the company to ensure it was a legitimate company. The man told the resident to deposit two large checks in a bank in Georgia. The resident deposited one check for approximately \$3450 but called a friend after becoming concerned. The friend told this resident that this was a scam. Fortunately, the resident did not deposit the second check which was for approximately \$6,000.00. The company said they were aware that someone is running a fraudulent scam using their company information.

- **November 8th – Possession of marijuana and marijuana paraphernalia and open container violation.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer detected the odor of marijuana when he approached the vehicle. The driver stated that he had some marijuana in his pocket. The officer also observed two open containers of beer in the vehicle. The officer searched the vehicle and found a marijuana cigarette and a smoking pipe. The officer photographed these items and seized them for placement into evidence. The driver was issued citations for possession of marijuana, possession of marijuana paraphernalia, and driving while license revoked. The passenger in the vehicle was issued a citation for having an open container.
- **November 11th – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** A resident reported that there was a loose dog running around on Pine Ridge Drive. The officer picked up the dog and placed the dog in the kennel at the police department. The officer contacted the owner of the dog who came to pick up his dog. The officer issued the dog owner a warning ticket for the violation since this was the first violation for this Pine Ridge Drive resident.
- **November 13th – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** A resident found a dog running loose and put the dog in her vehicle to bring it to the police department. The officer took the dog and placed the dog in the kennel at the police department. The officer contacted the dog owner. The dog owner came to pick up her dog and was given a warning ticket for this violation since this was the first violation for this Pine Ridge Drive resident.
- **November 14th – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** A resident of Airport Road reported that there was a loose dog in her yard. An officer picked up the dog and placed the dog in the dog kennel at the police department. A short time later a woman called looking for her missing dog. She picked up the dog and the officer issued the Airport Road resident a warning ticket since this was the first violation.
- **November 14th – Failure to stop for blue light.** An officer observed a vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed on Airport Road. The officer activated his blue lights and siren to have the vehicle pull over. The driver of the vehicle continued to drive down Airport Road and would never pull over. Other vehicles on the road pulled over but not the vehicle that had been speeding. The officer followed the vehicle all the way to Sandhills Community College where the vehicle pulled into a parking lot. A Sandhills Community College officer intercepted the vehicle making it come to a stop. The 18 year old driver told the officer that he didn't know that the officer was behind him. The officer issued the driver a citation for speeding and failing to stop for blue lights.
- **November 16th – Property damage.** An officer was dispatched to Sandpiper Drive regarding a car fire. When the officer arrived on the scene, he saw a vintage car with smoke coming from the vehicle and flames coming from the

floorboard of the vehicle. The driver indicated that he had been driving the vehicle when he realized something was wrong and pulled over to the side of the road. Then flames started coming from the floorboard. The vehicle was extensively damaged. The officer arranged for the vehicle to be towed as it was no longer drivable.

- **November 17th – Possession of marijuana and marijuana paraphernalia.** As a result of a traffic stop, the officer could see a small bag of marijuana in plain view while talking with one of the passengers. The officer had everyone get out of the vehicle and he searched the vehicle. The officer found 3 small bags of marijuana, 2 smoking pipes, a grinder, and rolling papers. All of the items were photographed and seized for placement into evidence. The driver was issued a citation for driving while license revoked. A female passenger was issued a citation for possession of marijuana paraphernalia. A male passenger received citations for possession of marijuana and possession marijuana paraphernalia.
- **November 19th – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** A resident of Lakeview Drive reported finding a loose dog in her yard. The officer went and picked up the dog. While putting the dog in his police vehicle a woman stopped in a vehicle and said the dog belonged to her. The officer gave the dog to the owner who is a Lakeview Drive resident. The officer issued the dog owner a warning ticket since this was the first violation.
- **November 20th – Identity theft.** A resident of Herons Brook Drive found some fraudulent charges on her business credit card. The charges were for airline tickets and bus fare totaling almost \$400. The resident contacted the bank about the fraudulent charges.
- **November 21st – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** A resident of Ray's Bridge Road reported some dogs running loose. An officer went to the dog owner's Ray's Bridge Road residence and issued a civil penalty to the dog owner as this is the 4th violation in the past year.
- **November 23rd – Possession of marijuana and marijuana paraphernalia.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer detected the odor of marijuana when he approached the vehicle. An officer searched the vehicle and found marijuana, a grinder, smoking pipe, and a lighter. The officer photographed all of the items and seized them for placement into evidence. The driver was issued a citation for possession of marijuana, possession of marijuana paraphernalia, expired registration, and an inspection violation.
- **November 29th – Failure to appear on driving while impaired charge.** An officer became aware of an active order for arrest on a Pine Ridge Drive resident for failing to appear on a driving while impaired charge. The officer went to the residence and placed the resident under arrest and transported her to the Moore County Jail.

- **November 29th – Failure to appear on a misuse of 911 system charge and probation violation.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer determined that the driver of the vehicle had an active order for arrest out of Cumberland County for failing to appear on a misuse of 911 charge. The officer also determined that a passenger in the vehicle also had an active order for arrest out of Cumberland County for a probation violation. The officer issued a citation to the driver for driving while license revoked. The driver and the passenger were both placed under arrest and transported to the Moore County Jail.
- **November 30th – Vandalism.** A construction site on Shadow Drive was vandalized. Someone spray painted outside the house that is under construction and the construction trailer. While checking the damage the officer also found that a kitchen island inside the house had also been spray painted. An officer found a spray paint can outside and collected it for evidence. Later in the day, the officer was able to determine that the vandalism was caused by two Aurora Drive juveniles. The officer spoke with their mother. The mother stated she would pay for the damages and the construction company owner was fine with that arrangement.

2. There were three (3) traffic accidents in the Village this month.

- **November 8th** – An accident occurred on Niagara Carthage Road. A deer ran into the roadway and struck the front of the vehicle. No injuries were reported and the vehicle was able to be driven from the scene.
- **November 19th** – An accident occurred on Airport Road when a deer ran into the roadway striking a vehicle. There were no injuries and the vehicle was able to be driven from the scene.
- **November 30th** – An unknown vehicle drove off the roadway on Pine Lake Drive and hit a wall at the end of the driveway, damaging it. The vehicle left the scene of the accident.

3. Safety (Department)

- We continue to provide training for police staff above what is required.

4. Safety (Village)

- Officers have been performing patrols in the areas where complaints have been received about vehicles passing stopped school buses.

5. Other Events of Interest

- **November 13th** – Senior Officer Holt attended the yearly NC SafeKids Meeting in Pinehurst.

- **November 14th** – Lt. Dozier attended the monthly Investigators Meeting that was held at the District Attorney’s Office in Carthage. Issues of common concern are discussed among local law enforcement agencies during these meetings.
- **November 30th** – Chief Campbell and Lt. Dozier attended a Crisis Leadership presentation given by Colonel Danny McKnight. He discussed his involvement in the event of October 1993 in Mogadishu, Somalia and related the commitment and leadership necessary to achieve mission success.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Goal #1: To provide a uniform standard that will enable personnel of the department to be more consistent in procedures when handling situations.

Daily briefings are being conducted by officers at shift changes. The Lieutenant and Sergeant have also discussed monthly schedule and operational concerns with all officers this month.

All officers completed policy reviews of General Order 009 – Tire Deflation Device and General Order 010 – Silent Alarm Activation Response.

A quarterly staff meeting was held on November 19th.

Goal #2: To provide for education and further development of department personnel to enhance officer and department professionalism.

All officers viewed a training video about the use of naloxone for overdose reversal. Also, the video discusses how naloxone can even be used during an event to save an officer's life or the life of other officers.

All sworn personnel completed Bloodborne Pathogens training on November 7th which is one of the required courses for the mandated in-service training.

Officer Hinson completed the mandated in-service training 2018 Legal Update on November 15th.

Lt. Dozier completed the Introduction to FinCEN webinar on November 15th.

Sgt. Graham completed the mandated in-service training 2018 Communication Skills with Persons in Crisis – de-Escalation Techniques course on November 8th and Officer Safety: Surviving Planned Attacks Against Law Enforcement Officers on November 17th.

Sgt. Graham, Senior Officer McNeill, Senior Officer Holt, Officer Hinson, Officer Strickland, and Officer Howard participated in firearms simulated training at Fort Bragg. Their simulated firearms training includes shotgun, rifle, and pistol simulated training.

Sgt. Graham, Officer Strickland, and Officer Hinson completed the week long Intox class that was held in Pinehurst on November 30th.

Goal #3: Provide for a higher degree of personal contact between community and department personnel.

There were no community events this month.

Officers welcomed 12 new residents this month and provided the new residents with a police “Welcome Packet” describing many of the services offered by our department.

Goal #4: Conduct special enforcement programs and participate in GHSP campaigns.

Officers conducted a checkpoint on Rays Bridge Road on November 20th. A total of 7 citations were written during this checkpoint. 3 of the violations were for people driving with no operating license. Our department also earned 50 points in the GHSP Step Reporting Program for conducting this checkpoint.

A second checkpoint was conducted on November 21st on Niagara Carthage Road near Pine Lake Drive. A total of 1 citation was written during this hour-long checkpoint. Our department also earned 50 points in the NC GHSP Step Reporting Program for conducting this checkpoint.

A third checkpoint was conducted on November 25th on Niagara Carthage Road near Lakeview Drive. A Carthage Police Department officer also assisted. Only 1 citation was issued during the hour-long checkpoint but again our department earned 50 points in the NC GHSP Step Reporting Program for conducting this checkpoint.

Goal #5: Continue current crime prevention programs to maintain the Village's low crime statistics.

We remain fully staffed.

There were no traffic complaints this month.

Officers have conducted:

- House checks – 577 (average 19 a day)
- Business checks – 1,043
- Store closings – 52
- Food Lion foot patrols - 67

We continue to have 10 seniors in the Senior Call In Program.

There were no requests for articles this month.

No traffic studies were conducted this month.

We have 5 certified child seat technicians. 4 officers and the Sergeant are certified child seat technicians.

Goal #6: Proactive approach in looking for safety concerns.

In our efforts to meet OSHA requirements, quarterly and yearly reviews of the Infectious Disease Control Plan have been scheduled. The next quarterly review will be scheduled for December.
