



From the Desk of Chief Domonic Campbell Monthly Report for Police Department

Date: February 3, 2020

Special Notes

Our department collected 5.1 pounds of pills this month.

Chief Campbell announced his retirement which will be effective April 1, 2020.

The process has been started by the Village Manager to replace retiring Chief Campbell.

Senior Officer McNeill has applied for his Advanced Certification with the North Carolina Training and Standards Division this month.

The new patrol vehicle that was ordered has arrived and is currently being outfitted with the police equipment.

Our department celebrated Chief Campbell's birthday and Officer Cirillo's birthday this month.

Events of interest for the month of January 2020

1. **There were twenty-one (21) incidents that were investigated this month. Of these incidents, twelve (12) involved an arrest with 16 total charges.**

After an arrest, officers are unavailable for at least 2 hours while processing and booking subjects at the Moore County Jail in Carthage. Serving a criminal summons does not require detaining or taking the subject to jail.

- **January 3rd – Identity theft.** A resident of Pine Ridge Drive reported that some fraudulent charges had been made on one of his credit cards. Some of the charges were made locally and some were online purchases. Investigation showed that the resident's grandson had made the purchases with the credit card. The grandson had permission to use the credit card.
- **January 4th – Larceny.** A manager at Food Lion reported that a woman walked out of the store with a grocery cart of items and never paid. The woman returned the following day and another worker identified the woman. The officer obtained video of the women walking out of the store with the stolen items and the video of the woman matched the identified woman. The officer obtained a warrant for her arrest. The officer arrested the woman at her residence in Carthage with the assistance of the Carthage Police Department. She was transported to the Moore County Jail.
- **January 6th – Possession of marijuana and failure to appear on an injury to real property charge.** As a result of a traffic stop, the officer detected the odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. As the officer had the driver and two passengers exit the vehicle, he noticed one passenger place something in the driver's purse. The officer took the purse and found that the passenger had placed some marijuana in the purse. The officer searched the vehicle but did not find anything else in the vehicle. The driver was issued a citation for driving on a suspended license and for the vehicle not being registered. The front seat passenger was arrested by citation for possession of marijuana. The officer determined that the backseat passenger had an order for arrest out of Cumberland County for failing to appear on an injury to property charge. The passenger was placed under arrest and transported to the Moore County Jail.
- **January 8th – Driving while license revoked.** As a result of a traffic stop for displaying a plate that belonged to another vehicle, the officer determined that the driver was driving on a revoked license. This driver had been stopped by Vass Police on 12/30/19 and the Carthage Police on 1/4/20 for the same charge. The officer issued the driver citations for fictitious plate, inspection violation, failure to register vehicle, no insurance, and driving while license revoked.

- Since this was the third violation by this driver in a little over a week the officer placed the driver under arrest and transported him to the Moore County Jail.
- **January 9th – Failure to appear on a speeding charge.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer determined that the driver had an order for arrest out of Bladen County for failure to appear on a speeding charge. The officer placed the driver under arrest and transported him to the Moore County Jail.
 - **January 9th – Violation of Village ordinance (barking dog).** A resident of Hardee Lane reported that her neighbor's dog was barking and barks constantly. The resident has tried to talk to the dog owner but has had no success. The officer went to the dog owner's residence and issued the dog owner a warning ticket as this was the first violation.
 - **January 10th – Assault on a female.** A resident of Whisper Grove Court reported that she had been slapped by her husband. When officers arrived, the husband was home but the wife was at a neighbor's house. The husband told the officers he had got mad at his wife and slapped her. The officers took photos of the wife's injuries. The officers placed the husband under arrest and transported him to the Moore County Jail.
 - **January 12th – Possession of marijuana and marijuana paraphernalia.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer determined that a passenger in the vehicle had an outstanding order for arrest out of Hoke County for failure to appear in court on a possess of a schedule II controlled substance. The officer also searched the vehicle and found a bag of marijuana and a grinder. The items were photographed and then seized for placement into evidence. The driver was issued a citation to the driver for displaying a revoked registration plate. The passenger was given a citation for possession of marijuana and marijuana paraphernalia. The passenger was then placed under arrest and transported to the Moore County Jail.
 - **January 16th – Possession of Schedule III drug and drug paraphernalia.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer detected the driver looking for her license in a bag that contained multiple pill bottles. One pill bottle had a dollar bill in it and a cut straw. The officer asked the driver about the pills and she stated she had the bottle with the straw in it for her drug addiction. The officer issued a citation to the driver for no insurance, displaying a revoked registration plate and driving without a license (her license was medically revoked). The officer photographed and seized the pill and drug paraphernalia for placement into evidence. The driver was then arrested by citation for possession of a controlled substance and drug paraphernalia.
 - **January 17th – Breaking and entering.** A resident of Ray's Bridge Road reported that two bicycles were taken from her garage while the garage door was open. Later in the day the resident reported that she just found out that her

daughter had allowed a neighbor to borrow the bikes and they were not stolen after all.

- **January 19th – Natural death.** An elderly resident of Shadow Drive passed away in his home while alone. He was found later by his adult son who reported it to 911. The officer stood by while EMS determined that there was no need for CPR as the person had been dead for a while. The officer stayed at the residence until the funeral home arrived to remove the body.
- **January 20th – Possession of marijuana and marijuana paraphernalia.** An officer observed a vehicle parked in the right-of-way in front of a stop sign and got out to check on the occupants. The officer detected the odor of marijuana inside the vehicle. The officer searched the vehicle and found a prescription bottled with marijuana inside and a glass smoking pipe. These items were photographed and then seized for placement into evidence. The driver was arrested by citation for possession of marijuana and marijuana paraphernalia.
- **January 22nd – Outstanding order for arrest for failure to appear on simple worthless check charges.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer determined that the driver had outstanding orders for arrest out of Cumberland County for failure to appear on 2 counts of simple worthless check charges. The officer issued the driver citations for speeding, expired registration, expired inspection, and driving while license revoked. The driver was then placed under arrest and transported to the Moore County Jail.
- **January 26th – Lost property.** A Food Lion customer reported that she believes she lost her wallet while at Food Lion. The officer checked video at the store and there is no indication that her wallet was stolen. There also was not indication that she dropped her wallet.
- **January 27th – Lost property.** A jogger found a set of keys and turned them in at the police department. An officer was able to use a gym tag on the key ring to locate the owner of the keys. The keys belong to a resident of Carthage.
- **January 28th – Identity theft.** A resident of Pine Lake Drive received an American Express letter stating that an account had been opened up in her name. American Express closed the account but the victim wanted a report since this fraudulent account showed up on her credit report.
- **January 29th – Identity theft.** A resident of Sabbatia Drive reported that someone fraudulently opened an American Express account in her name. The account has been closed by American Express.
- **January 29th – Warrant for failure to appear on a driving while license revoked charge.** As a result of a traffic stop, the officer determined that a passenger in the vehicle had an active warrant for arrest out of Cumberland County for failure to appear on a driving while license revoked charge. The passenger was placed under arrest and transported to the Moore County Jail.

- **January 31st – Order for arrest for failure to appear on a misdemeanor larceny charge.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer determined that the driver of the vehicle had an active order for arrest out of Lee County for failure to appear on a misdemeanor larceny charge. The officer placed the driver under arrest and transported him to the Moore County Jail.
- **January 31st – Identity theft.** A resident of Herons Brook Drive reported that she received a letter from American Express stating that someone had opened a bank account with her information. The resident advised that it was fraudulent and they closed the account.
- **January 31st – Identity theft.** A resident of Airport Road reported that she received a letter from American Express stating that someone had opened an account in her name. She contacted American Express and they advised her to file a police report. The account was closed by American Express.

2. There were two (2) traffic accidents in the Village this month.

- **January 2nd** – An accident occurred at the intersection of Airport Road and Princess Gate Drive. A vehicle pulled out of Princess Gate Drive into the path of an oncoming vehicle, striking the vehicle. No injuries were reported but one vehicle had to be towed from the scene.
- **January 11th** – An accident occurred at the intersection of Niagara Carthage Road and Airport Road. A vehicle pulled out from the stop sign on Airport Road and struck a vehicle that was travelling on Niagara Carthage Road. One driver was taken to the hospital to be checked out. And one vehicle had to be towed from the scene. The at fault driver was given a citation for making an unsafe movement.

3. Safety (Department)

- We continue to provide training for police staff above what is required.

4. Safety (Village)

- Extra patrols were conducted on New Year's Eve.
- Officers have performed numerous saturation patrols all month at the intersection of Niagara Carthage Road and Vass Carthage Road.

5. Other Events of Interest

- **January 15th** – Lt. Dozier attended the monthly Investigator's Meeting where issues of common concern are shared among local law enforcement agencies. Our department hosted this month's meeting.

- **January 23rd** – Lt Dozier attended the Moore County Sexual Assault / Domestic Violence Task Force meeting that was held at the Moore County Sheriff's Office.
- **January 27th** – Chief Campbell and Sgt. Graham attended the 911 meeting that was held at the Moore County Sheriff's Office in Carthage.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Goal #1: To provide a uniform standard that will enable personnel of the department to be more consistent in procedures when handling situations.

Daily briefings are being conducted by officers at shift changes. The Sergeant and Master Officer have also discussed monthly schedule and operational concerns with all officers this month.

There were no revised policies this month.

All officers completed policy reviews of General Order 037 – Pharmaceutical Drug Disposal Program and General Order 038 – Infectious Disease Control Plan.

Goal #2: To provide for education and further development of department personnel to enhance officer and department professionalism.

Master Officer Holt completed the mandated in-service training 2020 Armed/Unarmed Security/Company: Roles & Authority on January 13th, 2020 Career Survival: Training and Standards Issues on January 20th, and 2020 The Signs Within: Suicide Prevention Education and Awareness on January 22nd.

Lt. Dozier completed webinars on What Some BODY is Saying, Through Their Body Language on January 14th, the Methods to Detect Forged Documents webinar on January 16th, and Cognitive Interviewing & Courtroom Testimony on January 17th, and Gas Pump Skimming on January 23rd.

Officer Hinson completed the mandated in-service training 2020 The Signs Within: Suicide Prevention Education and Awareness and 2020 Armed/Unarmed Security/Company: Roles & Authority on January 15th and 2020 Career Survival: Training and Standards Issues on January 18th.

Lt. Dozier completed the mandated in-service training 2020 Armed/Unarmed Security/Company: Roles & Authority on January 16th and 2020 Career Survival: Training and Standards Issues on January 17th, and 2020 Signs Within: Suicide Prevention Education and Awareness on January 22nd.

Senior Officer McNeill completed the mandated in-service training 2020 Armed/Unarmed Security/Company: Roles & Authority on January 21st.

Officer Hinson successfully completed the 2-day Effective Court Testimony training at Wake Tech Public Safety Center on January 28th.

We continue to be fully staffed.

Traffic complaints were received about speeding on Pine Lake Drive and Lakeview Drive at the end of month. Officers will work these areas in the coming month.

Officers have conducted:

- House checks – 435 (average 14 a day)
- Business checks – 1,080
- Store closings – 54
- Food Lion foot patrols - 64

We continue to have 12 seniors in the Senior Call In Program.

We provided the The New Pitch with stats from January.

We have 5 certified child seat technicians. 4 officers and the Sergeant are certified child seat technicians.

Goal #6: Proactive approach in looking for safety concerns.

In our efforts to meet OSHA requirements, quarterly and yearly reviews of the Infectious Disease Control Plan have been scheduled. The next quarterly review will be scheduled for March 2020.
