



From the Desk of Chief Domonic Campbell September Monthly Report for Police Department

Date: October 1, 2019

Special Notes

We collected 8.25 pounds of pills this month.

Officer Cirillo completed his field training and has been released from training this month.

Our department was notified that our grant application for the 2019 Bulletproof Vest Partnership was approved. This will allow us to receive 50% reimbursement on up to three bulletproof vests within the next two years.

Officer Hinson completed the week long Crisis Intervention Training this month.

Events of interest for the month of September 2019

1. **There were twenty-four (24) incidents that were investigated this month. Of these incidents, fourteen (14) involved an arrest with 31 total charges.**

After an arrest, officers are unavailable for at least 2 hours while processing and booking subjects at the Moore County Jail in Carthage. Serving a criminal summons does not require detaining or taking the subject to jail.

- **September 1st – Simple assault.** Officers were called to a residence on Golden Leaf Circle. Dispatch said they could hear a woman screaming in the background. When the officer arrived, he could hear screaming and he was met by several children pointing towards the back of the house. Their father led the officer to his wife who was sitting on the floor. The husband thought his wife was having a relapse and she had been beating him for the last couple of days. There were visible marks on his neck and chest. The officer placed the female under arrest and transported her to the Moore County Jail. The officer gave the husband some information about the Mobile Crisis Unit.
- **September 1st – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** An officer observed two dogs running loose on Goldenleaf Circle. The officer also observed a man trying to call the dogs. He said he left the gate open and the dogs got out. The officer issued the dog owner a warning ticket for the violation since this was the first violation.
- **September 2nd – Simple assault.** A resident of South Lakeshore Drive reported that her two adult sons were fighting. When officers arrived, one of the brothers had already left the residence. The brothers got into a fight due to one of the brothers arguing with their sister. The one brother said they didn't hit each other they were just grappling. The brother that had left the house had shoved their sister and this got the brothers arguing. There were no injuries apparent on any of the adult siblings. The officer advised the sister and brother that they could go to the Magistrate if they wished to pursue charges against their brother. Neither of them wanted to do this.
- **September 3rd – Involuntary commitment.** Officers were notified by the Magistrate that he had involuntary commitment paperwork for a resident of Whispering Pines who was getting ready to be released from the Moore County Jail. Officers transported the resident to the hospital to be assessed by a doctor. The resident became combative at the hospital and had to be restrained. Officers

waited with the resident at the hospital for about 6 hours before they were advised by hospital staff that the resident was being admitted.

- **September 4th – Possession with intent to manufacture, sell or deliver, possession of controlled substance on jail premises, and possession of marijuana paraphernalia.** As a result of a traffic stop, the officer detected the odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. The officer asked the driver and the two passengers if there was anything in the vehicle or on their persons like drugs or weapons. They said no. The officer searched the vehicle and found a marijuana smoking pipe and cigarillo packet in the vehicle. A female officer came to the scene to check the three females in the car and found 3 individually wrapped bags containing marijuana in the bra of one of the passengers. The officer issued the driver a citation for speeding and possession of marijuana paraphernalia. The passenger was placed under arrest and transported to the Moore County Jail. Once up at the jail, the passenger was checked by a female detention officer and another bag of marijuana was found inside her bra. The passenger was charged with possession with the intent to manufacture, sell or deliver, and possession of a controlled substance on jail premises.
- **September 5th – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** A resident of Pine Ridge Drive reported that they found a loose dog. An officer went to the location and picked up the dog. The dog was placed in the kennel at the police department. The next day a man came to pick up the dog for his daughter. His daughter was watching this dog for a friend when the dog got out.
- **September 6th – Multiple orders for arrest for failure to appear in Court for numerous charges.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer determined that the driver had multiple active orders for arrest out of Moore County and Randolph County for failure to appear on possession of drug paraphernalia, simple possession of schedule IV drug, possession of marijuana, fictitious registration plate, reckless driving, no insurance, and no operators license. The officer issued the driver a citation for an expired registration and driving while license revoked. The driver was then placed under arrest and transported to the Moore County Jail.
- **September 7th – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** A resident of New Day Way reported a dog came charging at her while she was walking her dogs. The officer went to the dog owner's home and the dog owner admitted her dog ran across the street towards the neighbor. The officer issued the dog owner a warning ticket for the violation since this was the first violation.
- **September 8th – Missing person.** A resident of Princess Gate Drive wanted to report their adult son missing. They said he had been gone all weekend and they didn't know where he was. They tried calling him but his phone was turned off. The parents said he has never been away this long. The officer obtained

information on the son and had him entered in the system. The following day the parents reported that their son had come home. The officer confirmed that he had returned.

- **September 8th – Driving while impaired.** An officer observed a vehicle with no license plate light and then observed the vehicle swerving back and forth in its lane. The officer stopped the vehicle and noticed a strong odor of alcohol while talking to the driver. The officer asked the driver how much he had to drink and he stated “a beer.” The officer had the driver perform several roadside field sobriety tests and the driver did not do well on the tests. The officer placed the driver under arrest and transported him to the Moore County Jail. The driver had a blood alcohol content of .10.
- **September 10th – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** A resident of South Lakeshore Drive reported finding a loose dog. The officer picked up the dog and placed the dog in the kennel at the police department. The officer scanned the dog and found the dog had a chip. The dog belonged to a Herons Brook Drive resident. The officer contacted the owner. The owner came to the police department to pick up his dog. The officer issued him a warning ticket for the violation since this was the first violation.
- **September 10th – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** A resident of Rookery Lane reported that his two dogs got loose. The officer located the dogs and returned the dogs to the dog owner. The dog owner was given a civil penalty for this violation as this was the 8th violation within the last year.
- **September 13th – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** A resident of Herons Brook Drive reported that his dog was missing. The officer located the missing dog on Lakeview Drive. The officer returned the dog to the dog owner and issued the dog owner a civil penalty since this was the second violation of the ordinance.
- **September 14th – Breaking and entering.** A resident who was at his parent’s home on Pine Ridge Drive reported that his wife showed up and knocked on the door. She began arguing with her husband and then forcefully opened the doors and began screaming. His wife wouldn’t leave until he called 911. An officer went to the wife’s residence on Goldenleaf Circle. She admitted to going to the Pine Ridge Drive residence and arguing with her husband. She was placed under arrest for the breaking and entering and also for violating her release order from a previous arrest that was ordered by a judge. She was transported to the Moore County Jail.
- **September 14th – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** A resident of South Lakeshore Drive reported that a man was driving a golf cart and had two large dogs, that were not on a leash, running alongside the cart. The woman told the man that he should have the dogs on leashes. He told her to get out of his way or he would let the dogs loose on her. The officer went to the dog owner’s

residence and the dog owner said his dogs were out without a leash. The officer issued the dog owner a warning ticket for the violation as this was the first violation in the past year.

- **September 15th – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** Someone reported a loose dog running around the area of Memorial Causeway and Pine Ridge Drive. An officer went to the location and found the dog. The dog had a tag and the officer contacted the dog owner. The officer placed the dog in the kennel at the police department. Later that day the dog owner came to pick up his dog. The dog owner was given a warning ticket for the violation since this was his first violation.
- **September 20th – Larceny.** A resident of Pine Crescent Drive reported that his kayak was missing from the boat area at Pine Lake Dam. The kayak was not secured and was close to the boat landing.
- **September 20th – Failure to appear on a return rental property charge.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer determined that the driver had an order for arrest out of Cumberland County for failure to appear on a failing to return rental property charge. The driver was placed under arrest and transported to the Moore County Jail.
- **September 21st – Driving while impaired.** A resident called the police department to report that a family member was under the influence of alcohol and driving her vehicle on Hardee Lane. The officer located the vehicle and followed the vehicle for some time. The officer observed the vehicle cross over the white fog line several times, failing to maintain lane control. The officer stopped the vehicle. The officer could smell the odor of alcohol while speaking with the driver. The driver was fumbling while trying to locate her registration. The officer also noted that she had red, bloodshot eyes that seemed “glassy) and her speech was slurred. The officer had the driver perform several road side field sobriety tests. The driver did not perform well. The officer placed the driver under arrest and transported her to the Moore County Jail. The driver refused to submit a breath sample so the officer obtained a warrant to have her blood drawn. EMS arrived to draw the blood sample which will be turned into to the SBI lab for analysis. The driver told the officer that they might want to test the blood sample for other drugs while they are at it.
- **September 23rd – Carrying a concealed weapon and possession of an open container.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer detected the odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. The officer asked the driver if there was anything in the car that he needed to know about and she said no. The officer also observed two beer cans inside a bag on the passenger seat. The officer had the driver step out of the vehicle so he could search the vehicle. At this time, the driver told the officer she had a gun under the driver’s seat. The officer located a handgun case under the driver’s seat with a handgun inside. There were also

two empty beer cans in the car. A strong odor of alcohol came from inside the bag. The officer photographed these items and then seized the items for placement into evidence. The driver did not appear intoxicated. The driver was arrested by citation for carrying a concealed weapon and possessing an open container in the vehicle.

- **September 23rd – Verbal dispute.** A teenager who lives on Herons Brook Drive called 911 to report that she was involved in a verbal argument with her parents and that she did not feel safe. When the officers arrived, they spoke with the teenager who said she got upset with her father and wanted to speak to her step mother without her father around and the step mother said no the father had to be included. The father was frustrated with his daughter as she never does anything he tells her to do. The argument was all verbal. It was decided that the teenager would go stay with her grandparents for the night to allow everyone to calm down.
- **September 26th – Possession of marijuana and marijuana paraphernalia, possession of a stolen firearm, and carrying a concealed weapon.** As a result of a traffic stop the officer detected a strong odor of marijuana coming from inside the vehicle. The officer searched the vehicle and found marijuana, drug paraphernalia, and 7 stolen hemp plants, valued at \$7,000. There were 4 people in the vehicle. One of passengers was also found to be in possession of a stolen firearm. Four people were placed under arrest. All four were charged with possession of marijuana, one was charged with possession of drug paraphernalia, and one was charged with felony possession of a stolen firearm and carrying a concealed weapon. The Moore County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) was contacted and they were able to locate the owner of the hemp plants. The MCSO charged all four subjects with felony theft and felony possession of the stolen hemp plants.
- **September 27th – Violation of Village ordinance (dog at large).** An officer observed a resident with a dog off of the leash. The officer advised the new resident of the ordinance pertaining to dogs. The dog owner was given a warning ticket for the violation since this was the first violation.
- **September 30th – Driving while impaired.** An officer observed a vehicle weaving inside the travel lane. The officer stopped the vehicle and smelled an odor of alcohol when he approached the driver. The driver admitted to having 2 beers. The officer had the driver perform several roadside field sobriety tests. The driver did not do well on the tests. The driver was placed under arrest and transported to the Moore County Jail. The driver had a blood alcohol content of .12.

2. There was one (1) traffic accident in the Village this month.

- **September 16th** – A fire vehicle was attempting to leave a gas pump. The vehicle turned too sharp and side swiped the gas pump island barrier while pulling away. There were no injuries and the vehicle was able to be driven away from the scene.

3. Safety (Department)

- We continue to provide training for police staff above what is required.

4. Safety (Village)

- Officers have performed numerous saturation patrols all month at the intersection of Niagara Carthage Road and Vass Carthage Road after it was changed to a 4 way stop intersection.
- 3 officers worked during the concert on September 21st.

5. Other Events of Interest

- **September 8th – 11th** – Chief Campbell and Sgt. Graham attended the FBI's North Carolina 2019 Command College in Blowing Rock, NC. Some of the topics covered included: Walking the Narrow Road to Leadership, Crisis Response, Child Abduction Rapid Deployment Team, Media Relations, and Law Enforcement Survival.
- **September 24th** – Lt. Dozier attended the Moore County Human Trafficking Task Force Meeting that was held at the Moore County Sheriff's Office.
- **September 25th** – Chief Campbell and Lisa Weaver attended the NC Governor's Crime Commission Grant Workshop in Raleigh. This was a requirement of obtaining our upcoming grant.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Goal #1: To provide a uniform standard that will enable personnel of the department to be more consistent in procedures when handling situations.

Daily briefings are being conducted by officers at shift changes. The Sergeant and Master Officer have also discussed monthly schedule and operational concerns with all officers this month.

Sgt. Graham conducted a meeting with the officers on September 24th to go over some issues with the officers.

There were no revised policies this month.

All officers completed policy reviews of General Order 029 – Ride Along Program and General Order 030 – DWI and Drivers License Checkpoints.

Goal #2: To provide for education and further development of department personnel to enhance officer and department professionalism.

Officer Cirillo completed the following state mandated in service training this month: Best Practices for Officers During Community Dissent, Law Enforcement Intelligence Update: Gangs and Divisive Groups, 2019 Domestic Violence: Law Procedure Update, 2019 Juvenile Law Update, and 2019 Legal Update.

Lt. Dozier and Sgt. Graham successfully completed the 2-day Background Investigation class held at the Aberdeen Police Department on September 5th.

Senior Officer McNeill and Officer Strickland passed their DCI recertification tests and are recertified for another 2 years.

Sgt. Graham completed 2019 Juvenile Law Update this month. This is state mandated in-service training.

Goal #3: Provide for a higher degree of personal contact between community and department personnel.

Officers welcomed 22 new residents this month and provided the new residents with a police “Welcome Packet” describing many of the services offered by our department.

Chief Campbell, Lt. Dozier, Sgt. Graham, and Officer Cirillo attended the monthly LEO meeting in Carthage.

Goal #4: Conduct special enforcement programs and participate in GHSP campaigns.

Our department conducted a checkpoint on September 24th on Niagara Carthage Road near Lakeview Drive. The officers wrote two citations for operating a vehicle without a license. We also earned 50 points in the NC GHSP Step Reporting Program for conducting this checkpoint.

Goal #5: Continue current crime prevention programs to maintain the Village's low crime statistics.

We are fully staffed.

Our department has received traffic complaints this month about speeding on Lavender Drive, Lakeview Drive, and Birdie Drive. Officers have already conducted a total of 22 saturation patrols on these 3 roads. 6 warnings and 1 citation were issued for speeding during these saturation patrols.

Officers have conducted:

House checks – 368 (average 12 a day)

Business checks – 1,010

Store closings – 52

Food Lion foot patrols - 55

We added a new senior to our Senior Call In Program this month. We now have 9 seniors in the Senior Call In Program.

We provided the new The Pitch with stats from September.

We have 5 certified child seat technicians. 4 officers and the Sergeant are certified child seat technicians.

Goal #6: Proactive approach in looking for safety concerns.

In our efforts to meet OSHA requirements, quarterly and yearly reviews of the Infectious Disease Control Plan have been scheduled. This month Chief Campbell completed a quarterly review of the Infectious Disease Control Plan and found no changes needed to be made. The next quarterly review will be scheduled for December 2019.
